Lecture 1 - Einar Jarmund - JVA 28 May 6.30 - 8.30

Jarmund / Vigsnæs Architects (JVA) was established in Norway in 1996 by Einar Jarmund and Håkon Vigsnæs: Alessandra Kosberg joined as a partner in 2004. JVA's projects range from small cabins in the woods and interiors, to large scale hospitality projects and urban plans. The firm has developed expertise in designing for the Nordic weather as well as creating connections between the buildings and the distinctive Nordic landscape. The practice constantly explores how to innovate through the use and experimentation of materials. Their work includes the recent renovation of the Oslo School of Architecture and the Svalbard Science Centre.

Lecture 2 - Carl Turner - Carl Turner Associates 04 June 6.00 - 8.30

Carl Turner trained at the RCA in London and still regards himself as a 'maker'. He has worked at many practices, including Foster and Partners and Penoyre & Prasad. He founded Carl Turner Architects in 2006: the practice has established a reputation for high impact, low cost buildings. Carl Turner's Slip House in Brixton was the winner of the 2013 Manser Medal.

Lecture 3 - Andrew Grant - Grant Associates 11 June 6.00 - 8.30

Founded in 1997, Grant Associates are a landscape architecture and urban design practice with global reach, based in Bath and in Singapore. Andrew Grant was appointed a Royal Designer for Industry in 2012 in recognition of his pioneering global work in sustainable and ecological landscape architecture. He is an Honorary Fellow of the RIBA and Chartered Member of the Landscape Institute. The RIBA Lubetkin Prize was won in 2013 by Wilkinson Eyre and Grant Associates for Cooled Conservatories, Gardens by the Bay in Singapore.

Lecture 4 - Alex Ely-Mae 18 June 2014 6.00 - 8.30

Alex is a Chartered Architect, a Chartered Town Planner and Senior Partner at mæ. He was formerly Head of Sustainable Communities at the Commission for Architecture and the Built Environment and has gained professional experience at Foster and Partners, Ian Simpson Architects and Pierre d'Avoine Architects. Alex teaches at London Metropolitan University and lectures internationally on design and policy. He founded mæ to solve problems: 'To go beyond the traditional remit of the architect. We use our artistic skills to ask questions, our design skills to find solutions, technology to help make possibilities and leadership to influence.'

Lecture 5 - Robert Sakula - Ash Sakula 25 June 6.30 - 8.30

Robert Sakula worked for Sir Clough Williams-Ellis at Portmeirion; and with David Lea, the pioneer in sustainable architecture. He then joined DEGW Architects, working on projects in Mexico, Monte Carlo and the UK before co-founding Ash Sakula in 1994, with Cany Ash. Robert has taught architectural design at universities in the UK, Europe and in China. He is a RIBA Competitions Advisor and a Civic Trust Awards Assessor. He is a member of the London Borough of Newham Design Review Panel. The practice's recent awards include RIBA Award 2011, Carnival Arts Centre, Luton; and RIBA Award 2010, Chapter Arts, Cardiff.

Lecture 6 - Simon Knox - Knox Bhavan Architects LLP 02 July 2014 6.30 - 8.30

Simon Knox founded his practice in 1992: he was joined by Sasha Bhavan in 1996. Both are former partners of Edward Cullinan Architects. Over the years they have maintained close links with Edward Cullinan Architects as well as Penoyre and Prasad. In 2001 they built their own office in Camberwell, from which they work on a range of projects: they fulfil the traditional role of architect whilst still keeping to their original principles of the detailed understanding of building construction.

Lecture 7 - Sarah Featherstone - Featherstone Young 09 July 2014 6.30 - 8.30

Sarah Featherstone's Winchester Lecture coincides with the <u>Winchester Festival</u>. Sarah is an architect and director of Featherstone Young, which she founded with Jeremy Young in 2009. She has designed projects in the housing, community, cultural, education and commercial sectors. Their house, Ty Hedfan won an RIBA Award in 2011 and was shortlisted for the Manser Medal and the Stephen Lawrence Prize. The practice have been Finalists in BD Young Architect of the Year and Architecture Foundation's Next Generation Award. Sarah was previously the director of Featherstone Associates and prior to this was a founding partner of Hudson Featherstone Architects. She teaches at Central St Martins and has been a visiting critic at various UK architecture schools. Sarah is a CABE Design Panel Member and Southwark Design Panel Member and an External Examiner at Brighton University and the Bartlett.

Winchester 2014 Lecture 8 - Design Engine 16 July 6:00 - 8:30

Winchester-based practice Design Engine won two RIBA Awards in 2013 – for the St Alphege Learning and Teaching Building at the University of Winchester; and for Les Beaucamps High School on Guernsey. The practice's Abercrombie Building at Oxford Brookes University and the arts facilities at Radley College have recently been completed; and, most recently, Design Engine won an open competition to design a portable events space for the Winchester District to be used by community and arts organisations in the city and surrounding towns and villages
