Mells is a small village with strong connections to the Horner family (Lords of the Manor for centuries) and the Asquiths. Edwin Lutyens, with Eric Gill, created a memorial to Raymond Asquith after his death in the First World War and also a large porch which now serves as a bus shelter! Alfred Munnings made an equestrian memorial, and there are many other interesting things to see.

Our guide will be Dr Antonia Whatley, an art historian and lecturer specialising in the Italian Renaissance and paintings and memorials of the First World War.

We will leave Winchester by coach at 9 am and expect to be back by 5 pm. The cost will be £50 per member, including coach travel and donations to the church in Mells, where the memorials are. Lunch is not included, but there are several good places to eat in the village, including the Talbot Hotel.
